Hon Robin Chapple to the Parliamentary Secretary representing the Minister for Lands.

With reference to the Browse (Land) Agreement Bill 2012, I ask:

1. Are other ports allowed to be developed along the Kimberley coast (Annexure 1 - Map of the Kimberley Coastline) for other purposes other than the *Gas Processing Facilities* as defined in (8. Limitation)?
2. If yes why?
3. Are other Gas Processing Facilities and/or ports allowed to be developed along the Kimberley coast (Annexure 1 - Map of the Kimberley Coastline) for onshore gas production other than at the *Gas Processing Facility* precinct as defined in (8. Limitation)?
4. If yes why?
5. Is onshore gas production allowed to be processed at the *Gas Processing Facility* as defined in (8. Limitation)?
6. If yes why?
7. Is it correct that the Browse LNG Precinct will be developed as a single site for all LNG development on Kimberley coastline?

I thank the Member for some notice of this question.

1. - 6. The Browse (Land) Agreement does not preclude development along the Kimberley Coast for purposes other than for those activities indicated in clause 8 of the Browse (Land) Agreement.

However, any facility developed along the Kimberley Coast is required to obtain all relevant rights, titles, interests, approvals and permissions to establish that facility.

7. Yes – the Browse LNG Precinct will be developed as a single site for all LNG development on the Kimberley coastline.
