- 4. Is a bond still retained by the Department in respect of the company whose operation led to the collapse of the pillar?
- 5. If yes to (4), will those funds be mobilised to ameliorate the impacts of this collapse?

- 1. The tenement no longer exists as it was surrendered on 18 July 1982 by the tenement holder, Amoco Minerals Australia Ltd.
