I refer to the Natural Gas (Canning Basin Joint Venture) Agreement Act 2013, and ask

- 1. What is the nature of the ALP moratorium?
- 2. How long will the moratorium remain in place?
- 3. How will Labor's policy to enact a state-wide moratorium on fracking affect the Natural Gas (Canning Basin Joint Venture) Agreement Act 2013?
- 4. Are any test fracks proposed for any tenements in Western Australia?
- 5. If yes will they be allowed to proceed?

Answer

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I thank the Hon. Member for some notice of the question. The following information has been provided to me by the Minister for Mines and Petroleum.

- 1. The Government's policy is a ban on hydraulic fracture stimulation in the South West, Perth and Peel regions and a moratorium over the rest of mainland Western Australia while a scientific inquiry is undertaken into the practice. The Government is currently finalising mechanisms to implement this commitment.
- 2. During the scientific inquiry and until Government makes a further decision.
- 3. The Natural Gas (Canning Basin Joint Venture) Agreement Act 2013 is not affected by the policy.
- 4. There are, at present, no proposals to undertake hydraulic fracture stimulation either under assessment or approved by the Department of Mines and Petroleum.
